Roberta Espinoza is an Associate Professor of Sociology and Interim Associate Dean of Global and Local Programs and Director of the Institute for Global/Local Action and Study at Pitzer College. She received her B.A. from Pomona College and her Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of California, Berkeley. Espinoza's research examines issues of equity, access, and achievement for underrepresented students in the American educational system. She has written two books on minority and workingclass students' routes to college, and numerous articles on women of color in doctoral education and Latino undocumented students. Espinoza is also currently a Co-PI on a National Science Foundation S-STEM grant titled "MECHANISM (Mentors Enable, Connect, Help, Advocate, Nurture, Intervene, Sustain, and Motivate) for Success in the Sciences."



PIVOTAL MOMENTS: HOW FACULTY-STUDENT RELATIONSHIPS SHAPE CAREER ASPIRATIONS AND SUCCESS

Roberta Espinoza will present her "Pivotal Moment" framework to illustrate how academic interventions alter students' educational trajectories by transforming their social and psychological orientations toward academic achievement. She will share data on how these moments augment the accumulation of academic knowledge (cultural capital) and relationship-building skills (social capital) that facilitate school success for underrepresented minority students.
